



NAMTA EVENTS

Composition Festival

- Eligibility: Any NAMTA/OMTA/MTNA teacher may enter students
- Judging: The judge will receive \$15.00 per work
- Entry Fees: \$15.00 per work. A student may enter more than one work per level but must pay an additional entry fee for each work.
- Awards: Awards for Composition winners in each division will include a private lesson of 1-2 sessions with a professional composer who is a member of NAMTA. The fee is not to exceed \$30.00 per composer and may be scheduled for 1-2 hours at the student's request.

Fall Festival

- Eligibility: Any OMTA teacher or NAMTA student member may enter students in the Fall Festival. There are no certification requirements for studios wanting to participate.
- Judging: Judges are paid the OMTA rate of \$30.00 per hour plus current OMTA mileage (.58/mile) with a one hour minimum. Lunch is provided for any judges and monitors working a minimum of three hours.

- There will be a \$5.00 late fee per entry per day for up to three days maximum after entry deadline. No entries will be accepted after three days past deadline.**
- Awards: The Senior Award is \$50.00 cash reward for each senior who has participated in the solo memory division and/or ensemble division for the four years of high school.

Mall Marathon

- Eligibility: Students of NAMTA teachers
- Entry Fees: None

Scholarship Auditions (Music Camps)

- Eligibility: Students of a NAMTA teacher who are currently enrolled in grades 6-12. Students must have studied with their current teacher for at least six months. A student may not win more than four times. The instrument studied with the NAMTA teacher must be the primary camp focus.
- Judging: \$75.00 (no mileage)
- Entry Fees: \$15.00 per student

Awards: There can be up to five winners with a \$1,500.00 cap on awards. Award checks will be made out to the camp of the student's choice pending student's acceptance by said camp. Award winners are expected to perform on the Honors Concert. If the student doesn't attend any camp, the award will be returned to NAMTA.

Honors Concert

Eligibility: Students of NAMTA members. Each teacher is encouraged to select one or two students from his/her studio to perform on the annual Honors Concert. All ages are eligible and needed to create a well-balanced program.

Judging: None

Entry Fees: None

Repertoire: • Teachers should consider shorter and mid-length repertoire so more students can participate. Each studio is limited to 6 minutes maximum time so the recital length will remain manageable.

- All compositions are subject to committee chair approval.
- Teachers may accompany students and/or play duets with their students.

Memory: • Piano and vocal solos will be memorized.

- Duets/ensembles and instrumentalists may perform with music.

Other information: • Winners of the Scholarship Auditions will play on the Honors Concert.

- All participants will receive a certificate.
